

# INTERESTED IN AUCTIONS?

The words "sub hasta" are not well known in South Australia today. However, these are the Latin words for "by auction". When an auction took place among the Romans, it was customary to stick a spear in the ground to give notice to the Public of the sale by auction — literally "under the spear".

It is generally realised that no better means are available for effecting a fair and just sale, than a regularly and openly conducted auction with buyers invited to make successively higher bids or offers. It is an arrangement for increasing the price by exciting competition amongst purchasers.

Having the distinct advantage of enabling a variety of goods to be rapidly disposed of for eash name and requiring only the minimum of display, auctions throughout history have according to the Encyclopedia Britannica, "ranged from the spoils of war to the glittering prize of a principality itself".

In A.D. 193 for instance, the Roman Empire was cynically offered to the highest bidder by the Praetorian Guard who, shortly before, had assassinated their Emperor, Partinax. Julianus, a wealthy Senator was successful in the bidding, offering the equivalent of a gift of 250,000 senteroes to each guard (roughly \$400 per man). The guard greedily accepted the offer but killed bulianus soon afterwards.

Almost every conceivable form of goods, including that of the "monarrous and degrading custom" of slavery have been, or are currently being, disposed of shrough the auction methods.

Auctionecting as a profession has taken some important strides towards recognition and professonalism in the last few years. In South Australia the Auctioneers and Appealners Association has been formed. This Association has committee members who are willing to devote the necessary time and energy to auctioning because they are generally interested in the welfare of auctioning as a profession. These and numerous other improvements are propelling us along the road towards professoreal recognition in the field of services and sales. This Association together with the Real Estate Institute of South Australia is now conducting, on a regular basis schools for auxtionochs.

These schools cover livestock, chartel and read estate auctions. Perhaps the greatest benefit of these schools is seen by the willingness of all registrants to descure their efforts, faults and improvements in a professional and honest manner. This overall feature receives most favourable comment in the final evaluation of the schools by registrants.

Remember when you examine the facts and challenge the myths there seems to be little examn why more chattels, stock and properties to South Australia should not be offered for sale by auction:— the most successful method of selling.

The first public auction of Australian stool was held in Garraway's Coffee House, Change Alley, Combill, London on 17th August 1821.

It consisted of the sale of a number of bales of wool belonging to Captain John Macarthur. His wool sold from 29 pence to 124 pence per pound. This top price remained a record for the next 100 years.

In Australia, the first sale of wool by auction was held in Adelaide in 1840. On 3rd March of that year, Messrs. Solomon sold 208 bales of wool: 25 of which sold at 1435 pence per pound, 150 at 14 pence, 25 at 1335 pence and 8 washed, at 16 pence per pound.

Wool Auctions began in Australia in the following order: 1810 Adelaide, 1843 Sydney, 1848 Melbourne, 1856 Geeleng, 1869 Ballarat, 1895 Albury, 1896 Brisbane, 1902 Hobart, 1911 Launceston, 1913 Perth, 1929 Newcastle, 1931 Goulburn, 1963 Albany and Portland.

The Australian Wool Corporation (A.W.C.) was established in 1972 by the Federal Government and incorporated the former Australian Wool Board. The A.W.C. functions by the "Wool Marketing Act".

# IT'S NOT ALL DOOM AND GLOOM!

Good properties are still selling well, despite some negative talk and newspaper reports.

This is the feeling of Michael Brock from Brock Younger & Co. Real Estate.

At the time of writing, 100% of the 24 properties offered by auction by Brock Younger & Co. since Christmas have sold.

Of these, 75% have sold under the hammer, the balance either before or after auction.

Much of the depressed climate comes from the members themselves. Surely the industry would prosper more if agents said "Sure, the market is not as strong as it was last year, but properties are still selling" rather than complaining to the public that the market is not good.

The combined effect of negative gearing, interest rate rises (and therefore lack of availability of moregage funds), plus the fact that S.A. real estate has just gone through a boom period, all led to a downwards readjustment of prices through November and December.

These months were certainly difficult, as vendors had to be made aware that the prices they were hoping for were simply not achievable.

Since late December, however, vendors are more aware interest rates appear to have peaked, and there are a lot more boyers around. 150 people came through an open inspection last week at St. Peters in just one hour.

On January 3rd a crowd of over 200 people attended an auction at Hyde Park of a six roomed villa which required some upgrading. It was vold by Brock Younger & Co. for \$222,000 with five bidders competing.

The main point is to pick the properties you recommend to auction. Gertainly home units and townhouses, first home buyer properties north and south of the city and oven small attached cottages, are not attracting enough buyers for auction.

However, better homes close to the city are still in strong demand, especially those in the \$150,000 to \$450,000 price bracket.

The upper end of the market is particularly strong, with people looking for the tax sanctuary of their own family home.

Two further points are worth mentioning. For an auction programme to be successful, a property does not necessarily have to be sold on the day. Either it can be sold prior to auction, or afterwards. Even if it is passed in, at least the vendor can be made to realise what the market feels the home is worth, and a sale should quickly follow. Vendors should be made aware of this from the outset.

The last point is one that is sometimes overlooked. It is very easy for an auctioneer to claim the credit when he conducts a sale which runs in excess of the owner's reserve price. He should never lose sight of the fact, however, that a strong and professional sales team is crucial for success. If the sales team have not convinced several people that they should hid for the property and nurtured them to the extent that they are there on the day with their cheque books, then even the best auctioneers cannot create something out of nothing.

Brock Younger & Co. are optimistic about the future. Although things will probably remain reasonably static over the next six months or so, we believe that towards the latter part of the year, there will be a return of confidence and therefore an increase in prices. There are already signs that this trend has started.

#### S.A.'s 3rd LARGEST INDUSTRY SHOWS GOOD GAINS ON LAST YEAR'S YEARLING SALES

Horse racing enthusiasts from all around Australia gathered in Adelaide recently for South Australia's annual yearling sales. The two day Auction of young horses was conducted at the Morphettville Racecourse and attracted 500 entries. from thoroughbred breeders. The yearling sales are the traditional source of new young racchornes and the sales act as the front window for the Thoroughbred Breeding Industry in this State. Not many people realise that the racing industry is the 3rd largest industry in South Australia and creates over 11,000 employment opportunities. The yearling sales themselves apart from providing the annual income to many stud breeders. also bring many millions of dollars into the South Australian economy.

Top price paid at the sales was \$110,000 for a filly by the Lindsay Park Stud Stallion, Godswalk. Purchased by Bart Cummings, the trainer of many Melbourne winners, the filly will be raced in Sydney. Star of the yearling sales was in fact the progeny of Godowalk. Two other Godswalk yearlings made \$100,000 whilst a third made \$90,000. In total 11 yearlings by Godswalk went under the auction hammer at an average price of \$69,000. This may seem an incredible average, which it is, but other yearlings by him averaged \$160,000 in New Zealand recently and one sold in Ireland last year for 400,000 pounds.



Lot 147, a filly by Vain Papa, was purchased by The Celes Corporation, Adelaide, for \$23,000 on behalf of New Zealand interests.

The world record holder, Without Fear, was represented by 14 yearlings in the sale and these sold to \$90,000 at an average price of \$47,500. Third in the list of average prices was the French-bred stallion Twig Muss. His draft of 14 yearlings sold to \$80,000 at an average of \$43,208.

The two day sale turned over \$5.2 million at an average of \$13,890. This result was most pleasing as it showed good gains on the corresponding sale last year. Spare a thought for the Auctioneers who operated II hours straight on the first day and 8 hours the second day.

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
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
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

- Price is usually not disclosed so you remove the objection factor.
- Forces buyers to make decisions to a deadline of the auction date and brings negotiations to a head.
- The Auctioneer's skills, enthusiasm and techniques can maximise the price.
- Vendors control their reserve price and settlement date and accept or reject varied terms and get cash contracts, which usually settle in 30 days.




